Near New Year and summer holidays, executives of various organizations get organized to provide decent services for the pilgrims.

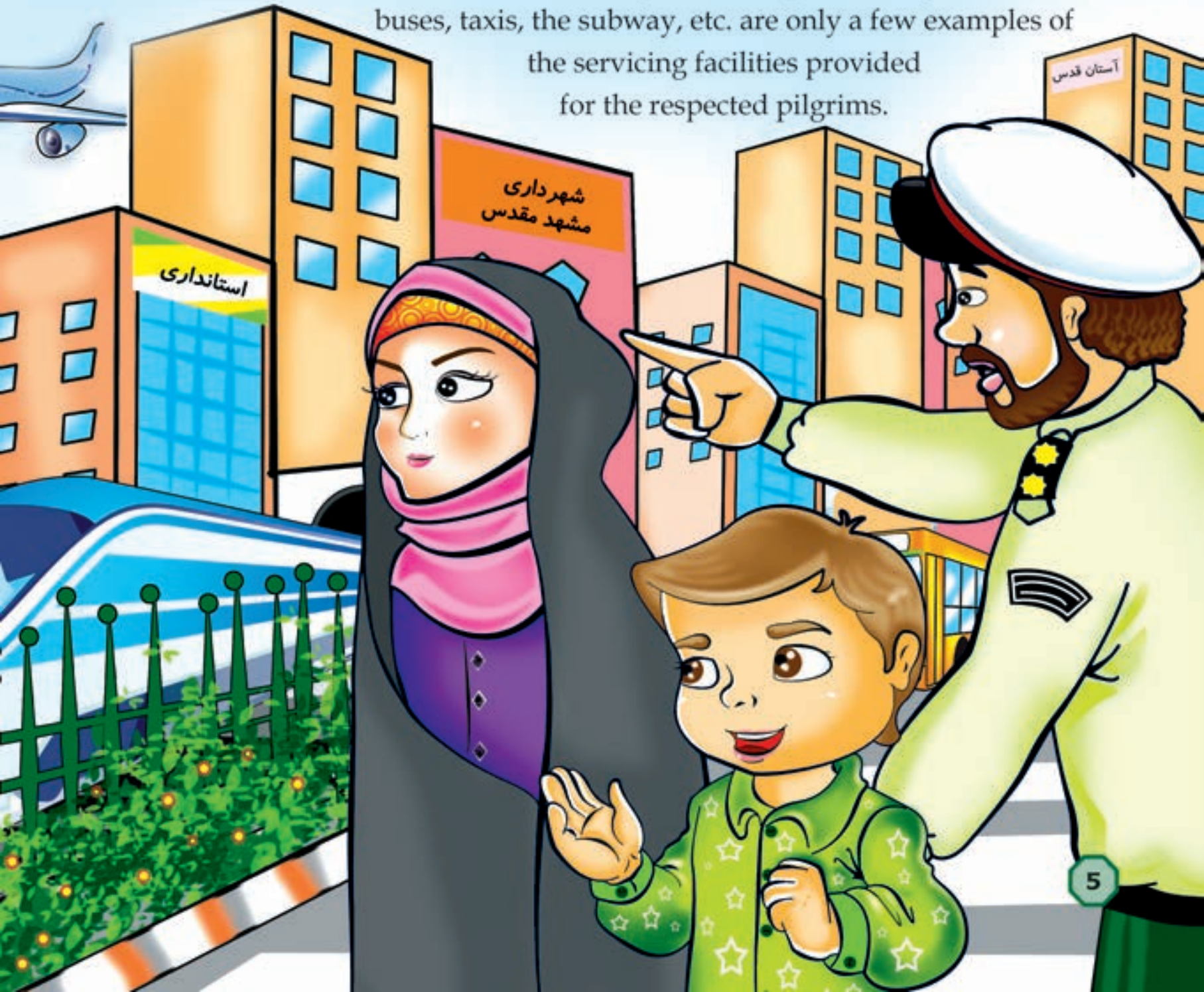
