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





Gawharshad Mosque is one of the best known mosques in Iran.

A big azure dome, a courtyard, four porches and seven large prayer halls are among the constructions of this mosque.









Jami-i Razavī courtyard is the largest courtyard of the Holy Shrine of Imam al-Reza (A.S.). This courtyard contains three big porches and portals. They are named as Valī-yi 'Asr Porch, Bab al-Kawthat, and Bab al-Qadīr. Two lofty minarets have been constructed on both sides of each porch.







Like J\sum mi-i Razav\(\text{i}\) courtyard, Quds Courtyard is also built after the victory of the Islamic Revolution of Iran. The existence of a beautiful water-fountain in the middle of this courtyard brings to mind the memory of the Holy Mosque in Jerusalem.
