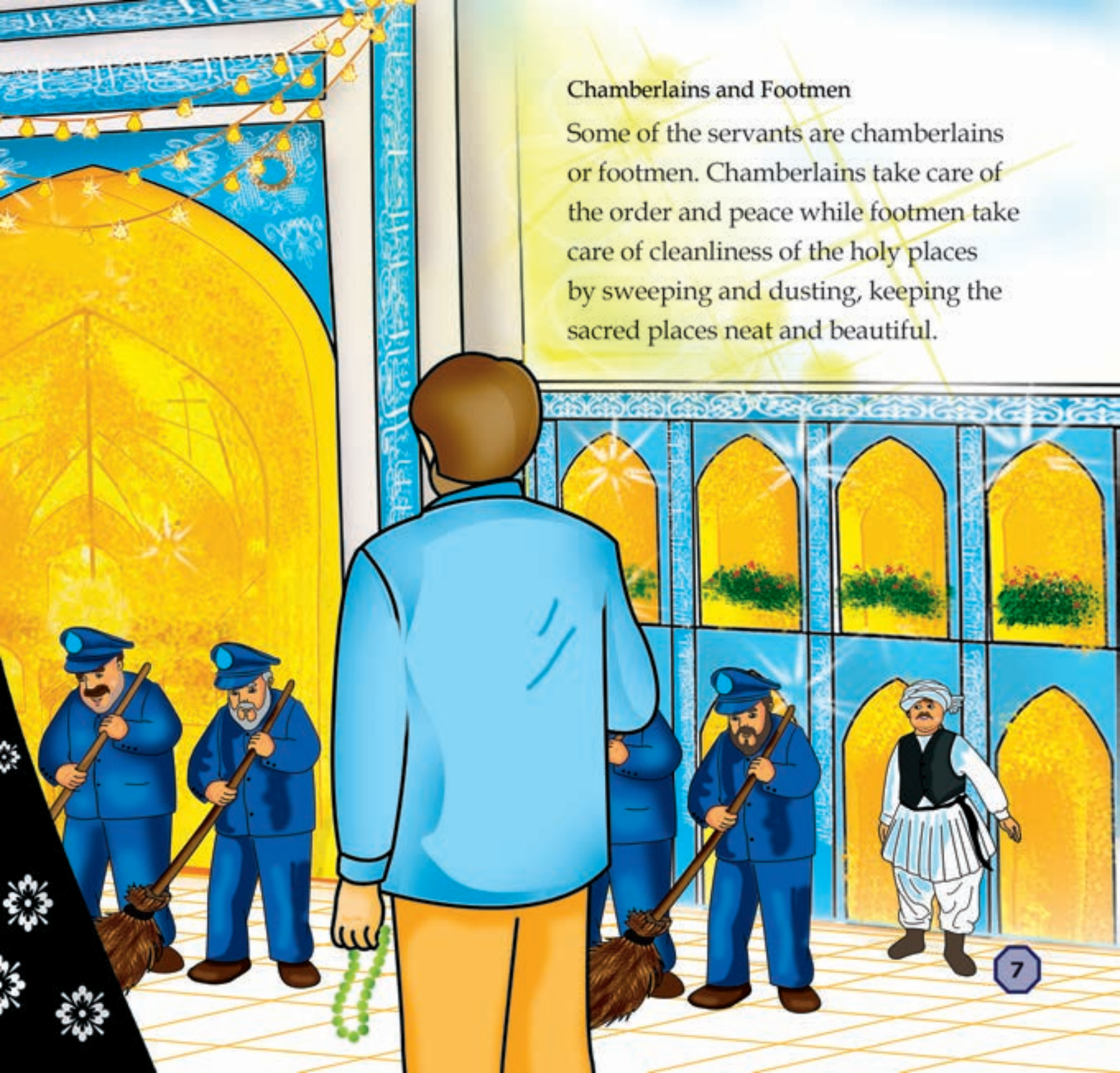




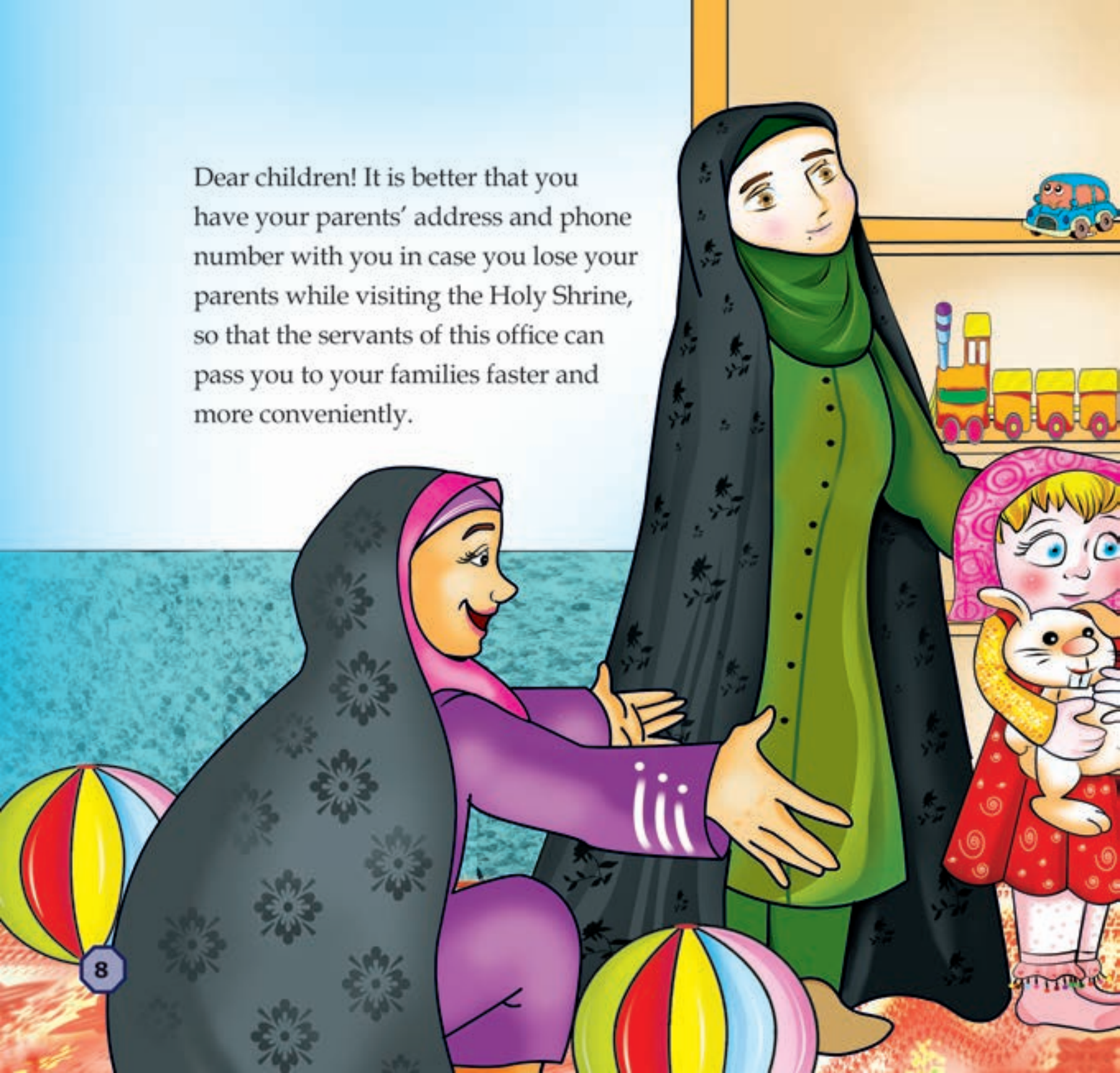


Chamberlains and Footmen

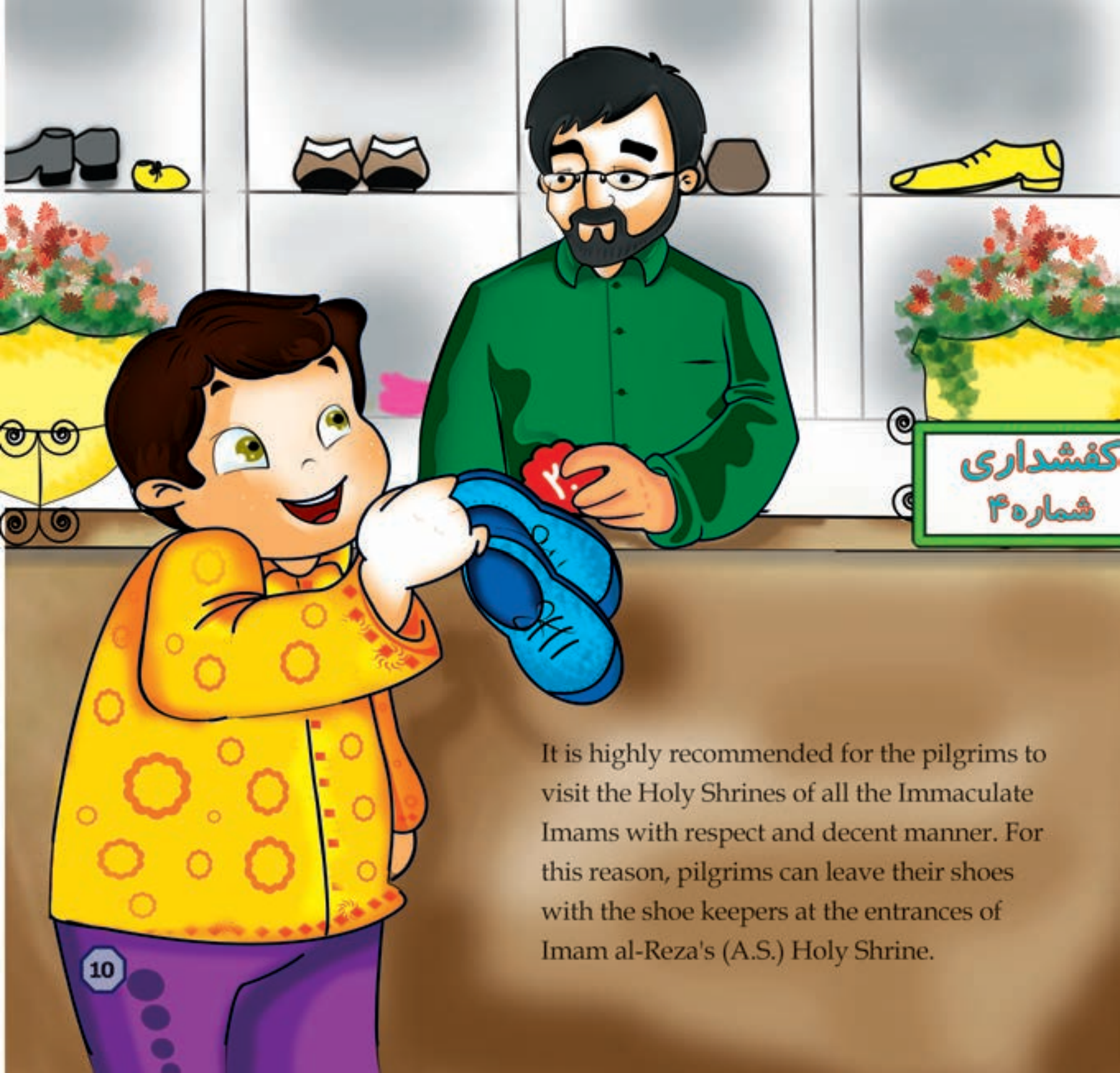

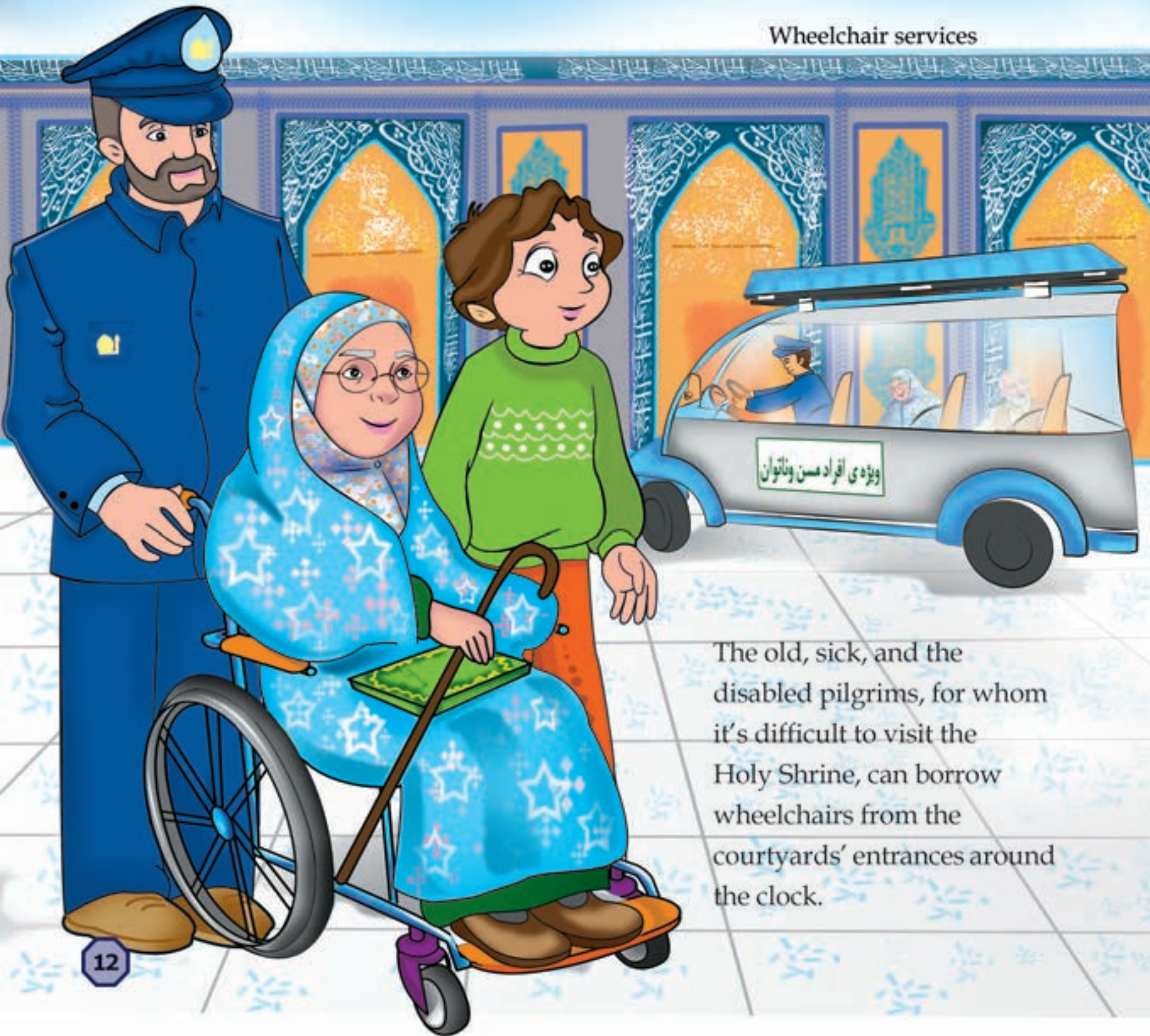
